
Consumer Confidence


Michigan Residents' Beliefs About Whether They Are Better Off or Worse Off Than One Year Ago, 1994-2009









In Winter 2009, 70.7% rated President Obama as "Excellent" or "Good." This is the highest since 2002.



State of the State Survey: Michigan Residents' Ratings of Presidential Performance, 1994-2009





Governor Granholm's ratings improved to their highest level since 2006.



Improvement in Governor Granholm's Performance Ratings, 2008-2009










